REFLECTION - by Fr Michael Tate. St John's Gospel never calls John, 'the Baptist'. No, he is John the Witness: 'a witness to speak for the Light'. We

discover in this Gospel that this light is embodied in Jesus Christ, most Transfiguration when Christ' body is radiant, translucent, with Divine Light.

lesus Christ is the light of the world, the One who came to liberate human beings from the many dark captivities which imprison them, the One who vanquished the inky blackness of the tomb.

We can become partakers in the life of this Divine Light. At Saturday Vigil for the lighting of a small candle from the great Easter candle which is sung into the church on the Easter Vigil as 'Christ our Light', the Conqueror of Death.

As a baptised people our allegiance to 'The Light' is not to be a private matter like John, we must bear witness to 'The Light' by being instruments of His power to dispel the darkness which can enshroud people's lives.

We could pause for a moment to commit ourselves to fulfil the promise of our baptismal candle so that we might more authentically celebrate the birth of the Divine Light com into human history.

DO YOU WISH TO ATTEND A WEEKEND MASS? You cannot just turn up for Mass as previously!! YOU HAVE TO REGISTER WITH THE PARISH OFFICE BY the FRIDAY (12noon) BEFORE THE WEEKEND MASSES. We are unable to accommodate more than 90 in our Church, and it will not be possible to admit parishioners

who have not pre- registered. Please arrive <u>early</u> for Mass (at least <u>15</u> minutes beforehand). <u>Church doors are locked as Mass begins</u>, No collections are taken up at Mass. Usual Parish Collection donations can be placed in the baskets provided on the table at the Church entrance door. If you are elderly (70 years +) or not feeling well, the ruling states that, (for your own safety) YOU MUST STAY AT HOME.

After entering the Church for Mass, your hands will be sanitized and your temperature taken. (This is obligatory) then a Monitor will show you to a seat, where <u>Social distancing (4</u> sq meters) must be strictly observed, (except for people of the same house-hold). Holy Communion (in a single file) <u>must</u> be Received in the hand **Nobody** will be permitted to socially assemble in the courtyard before, during and after Mass.

ROSE SUNDAY: The Third Sunday of Advent, is the midpoint of our preparation for the birth of our Saviour, Jesus. It is a Time to encourage each other in our spiritual preparation for Christmas. *The Third Sunday of Advent is known* as Gaudete Sunday or Rejoice Sunday. *The Third Sunday of Advent indicates* that

the season of penance is coming to an end and soon we will be rejoicing in the celebration of Christmas. *Priests wear Rose Vestments on the Third Sunday of Advent* because: Baudete is the Latin word that means rejoice. This is why Priests have the option of wearing Rose on this particular Sunday.
